**WHEREAS**, as Richmond County Hospice continues to grow and make a bigger impact in our county and beyond, the organization will continue to focus on the individual, not the illness and honoring life's final journey, leaving a legacy of compassionate care; and

**WHEREAS**, our local Hospice Family helps everyone: the terminally ill, the bereaved, the whole community as they serve our friends and neighbors during the most painful and difficult time of their lives.
